

Marjorie Jones and Dr. Mock

Marjorie Jones was the ward of Dr. Mock of Prairie Grove, Arkansas. He was a wealthy bachelor who never married. He informally adopted Marjorie and her sister from a large and poor family. The girls' parents were hard pressed to feed all their children.

Dr. Mock paid and arranged for Marjorie's education. She attended pharmacy school and became a registered pharmacist in the state of Arkansas in November of 1929. She also completed training to be a registered nurse (R.N.).

Marjorie used her training in nursing a great deal more than her education in pharmacy school. She helped to deliver many babies.

Dr. Mock and Marjorie Jones were both very active in the Prairie Grove United Methodist Church. They lived together in Dr. Mock's house on N. Neal Street until he died on July 18, 1971. The house has since been destroyed. Dr. Mock donated his property to the United Methodist Church.
